There is no doubt about it, 2020 was a year for the history books. This time last year we never could have predicted what 2020 would have meant for us all, and how it would have changed our day-to-day lives. We couldn't have predicted that for 6 weeks we would be glued to our TV for 1pm press conferences, that we would commemorate Anzac Day at our front gates, or that the Easter Bunny would have to be given special essential worker rights in order to deliver Easter treats.

Through it all – a strict lockdown, border closures and QR scanning, South Cantabrians have shown our resilience. As a team of 60,000 we have pulled together, saved lives and now we are supporting our local economy by supporting our local businesses.

Of course, in between the global pandemic, we had an election campaign. A longer one than usual! The outcome of the 2020 General Election humbled me. To win the Rangitata electorate by a margin of 4400 is an absolute privilege, with which I will not take for granted. I promised to be a strong voice for this electorate – to take your concerns and issues to Wellington and advocate for our people, and this remains my position. I have held one constituent clinic in Temuka already, and these will be regular fixtures.

I will be doing this as the newly elected chairperson of the Primary Production select committee, and also as a member, again, of the Education and Workforce select committee. I am incredibly proud to have been given these positions – and have a lot of work ahead of me. I'm up for the job.

As chairperson of the Primary Production committee I will work alongside farmers and growers here locally, and all over New Zealand, to maximise the export value of our primary sector, to create and secure new jobs, and to support our brand for a clean, healthy and productive future.

On the Education and Workforce committee we will continue to work on our ambitious plan that builds on the work done last term, like launching the Lunch in Schools programme.

Now, 2020 has drawn to a close. The year we never saw coming. But we have tackled the issues head-on, we went hard and early which has left us in a better position than most countries in the world – and whilst there is a lot of work to do in order to support our families, businesses and communities, I am confident we can do it together.

Milford Community Charitable Trust Recipients 2020

Trustees of the Milford Community Charitable Trust recently held their annual presentation evening to award grants to successful applicants from the Milford community.

Milford Community Charitable Trust

The Trustees invite applications from people within the Milford area seeking grants to enable them to undertake a tertiary or vocational education programme or a life skills course.

The trust was formed in 2007 to administer funds received from the sale of the Milford School property which was closed due to amalgamation.

This was unfortunate because the school property had originally been donated to the district by the late Mr J T M Hayhurst on the 6th of March 1871, whereby he set apart land in trust for children attending the Milford Public School, and for the promotion of education of those children.

ELIGIBILITY; applicants must either...

- a) be former pupils of the Milford School
- b) parents or grandparents must be former pupils of the Milford School
- c) residents of the Milford district as defined by the district boundaries decided by the trustees.

Grants will be made available for educational, vocational training or personal development, with preference being given to education.

OPIHI COLLEGE AWARDS 2020

After an unusual year where schools were closed due to the pandemic and students were forced to proceed with their learning on line, Principal Miss Johnson shared her excitement that Opihi College were able to acknowledge their top scholars and sports people at an Awards Ceremony. Head student Hamish Fikken thanked Opihi College and commented "I think with all the endless opportunities here at Opihi, the amazing staff that go above and beyond for their students and the small, tight knit community, this school is really going in a very positive direction. I hope that the students and members of this community have a real sense of pride in this school because I do!"

The worthy winner of the Comer Cup for Top Academic Scholar in Year 13 and 2020 Dux of Opihi College was Emily Bennett. Emily also won Endeavour Awards in Japanese, Merit Award in Calculus; Outstanding Attainment in Design & Visual Communication and Japanese, the Heartland Ricoh Award, The Johnson Trophy for Outstanding Attainment in Senior English and a Dowells Office Product Award, The Lovatt Trophy for Outstanding Attainment in Senior Art, the Millar Engineering Award and the Richard Pearse Family Trust Award for Excellence in Science.

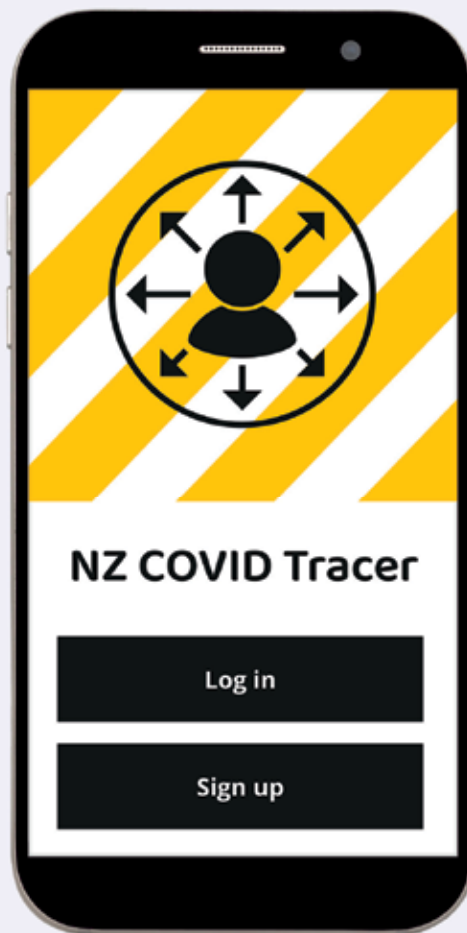

Spectacular Bristol Cup victory for Temuka Bowling Club

The Temuka Bowling Club has made a spectacular start to the season and could now be rated the top performing bowling club in South Canterbury.

The highlight has been the men winning the Bristol Cup, symbol of interclub supremacy, for just the fourth time in the 108-year history of the trophy.

Temuka led throughout the round-robin phase of the competition, earning the right to host the playoffs. In the semifinal it beat Awamoia (Oamaru) three games to one, and the scoreline was the same in the final against Geraldine.

Temuka last won the Bristol Cup in the 1983-84 season, and before that in 1979-80 and in 1925-26.

Heading into the Christmas break, Temuka was also going well in the other interclub competitions - 1st equal in the men's division 2, first in the Friday pairs, and second equal in the popular Wednesday triples competition.

While the women did not win either of the two pre-Christmas interclub competitions they finished in the top four for a creditable outcome.

Temuka has also figured strongly in South Canterbury championship events.

Sam Morton, Marshall Stoddart and Travis Cook won the centre triples, Morton and Stoddart then combined with Greg Valentine and Dave Wood to win the centre fours, and Merv Davey came through in a high-quality field to make the final of the singles where he was pipped by "young gun" Tom Taiaroa.

The win in the centre fours was freakish, with the Temuka team trailing 14-9 going into the last end. Outstanding bowls by Morton and Stoddart saw Temuka score five shots and force an extra end.

Their Geraldine opponents held the upper hand until the last bowl of the

game when Morton pushed a teammate's bowl to sit beside the jack and take the win. For the 30-year-old Morton it was his fifth South Canterbury title, earning a gold star.

In the women's centre triples, Cathy Richards, Shirley Whyte and Noleen Milne lost in the final after winning the event last season.

The performances of the Temuka players have also been recognised by the South Canterbury selectors with 12 players making up more than a quarter

of the men's and women's senior and development teams.

And those teams have been performing. In the most recent quadrangular tournament, South Canterbury beat Canterbury, North Otago and Canterbury Country in both development grades and the women's, while the men finished level with Canterbury but were beaten on differential. However, in the singles, pairs, triples and fours games against Canterbury, the South Canterbury men won 3-1.

What is Disc Golf?

With the recent opening of a new Disc Golf course at Torepe Fields behind the Temuka Holiday park, it seemed a good idea to look into what the game is about, how to play, who can play and how much it costs.

Discs can be hired from Muka Putt, the Temuka Holiday Park, with Temuka Hammer Hardware stocking a variety of discs for different ages and levels.

The following is from the New Zealand Disc Golf website, www.discgolf.co.nz.

Disc golf is played much like traditional golf. Instead of a ball and clubs, however, players use a flying disc, or Frisbee®. The sport was formalized in the 1970's, and shares with "ball golf" the object of completing each hole in the fewest number of strokes (or, in the case of disc golf, fewest number of throws).

A golf disc is thrown from a tee area to a target which is the "hole". The hole can be one of a number of disc golf targets; the most common is called a Pole Hole® - an elevated metal basket. As a player progresses down the fairway, he or she must make each consecutive shot from the spot where the previous throw has landed.

The trees, shrubs, and terrain changes located in and around the fairways provide challenging obstacles for the golfer. Finally, the "putt" lands in the basket and the hole is completed. Disc golf shares the same joys and frustrations of traditional golf, whether it's sinking a long putt or hitting a tree halfway down the fairway.

Who Plays Disc Golf?

Disc golf can be played from school age to old age, making it one of the greatest lifetime fitness sports available. Specially-abled and disabled participate, giving them the opportunity to take part in a mainstream activity. Because disc golf is so easy to learn, no one is excluded. Players merely match their pace to their

capabilities, and proceed from there.

One of the great features disc golf shares with traditional golf is that they are both played in beautiful settings. A nine-hole disc golf course can be established on as little as two hectares of land, and a championship-caliber 18-hole course on 12 to 16 hectares. The ideal location combines wooded and open terrains.

Why should I play?

The ongoing fitness boom finds more and more people taking up recreational activities in an effort to improve health and quality of life. Disc golf provides upper and lower body conditioning, aerobic exercise, and promotes a combination of physical and mental abilities that allow very little risk of physical injury. Concentration skills increase by mastering shots and negotiating obstacles. Players of limited fitness levels can start slowly and gradually increase their level of play as fitness improves.

Perhaps the greatest attribute of the sport is the expense - or rather, the lack of it. A professional quality disc costs less than \$30, and it only takes one for basic play.

And, of course, there's the sheer fun of the game - no matter what your age or skill level!

TALKING HEALTH AND FITNESS *with Shane*

Happy New Year. Welcome to 2021 and well done for staying positive last year and keeping our country moving. But we are not out of the woods yet, so let's keep 'staying healthy' a big priority this year.

Are you wanting to get your eating and fitness back on track after a little too much sitting at the lake and eating Christmas pud? Are you thinking you need a more organized way of eating?

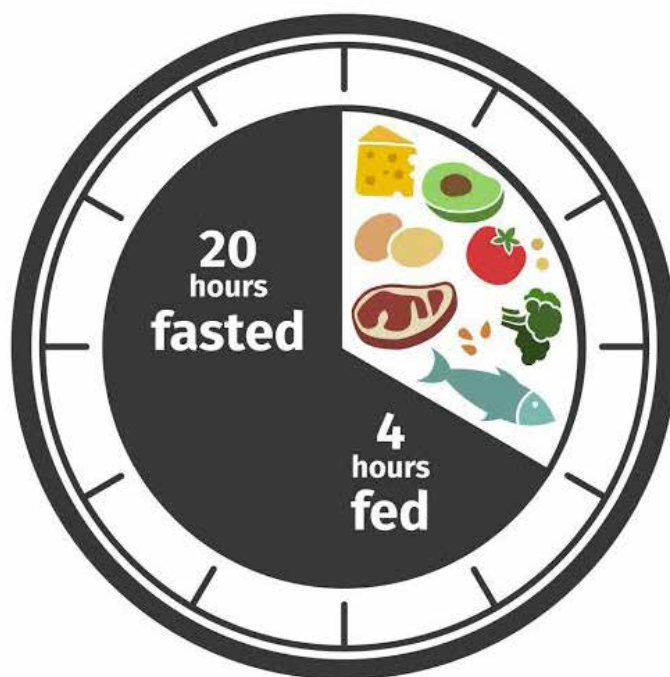
Have you thought about 'Intermittent Fasting'?

What is it and 'why would you do it'?

Intermittent fasting is not a diet, it's a pattern of eating. Intermittent fasting doesn't have to change what you eat initially, it changes when you eat.

Why is it worthwhile changing when you eat?

To understand how intermittent fasting leads to fat loss we first



need to understand the difference between the fed state and the fasted state.

The body is in the **absorptive (fed) state** when it is digesting and absorbing food. Typically, this state starts when you begin eating and lasts for four to five hours as your body digests and absorbs the food you just ate. When you are in the fed state, it's very hard for your body to burn stored fat because your glucose

and shortly after insulin blood levels are high as the body stores excess fuel.

After that timespan, your body goes into what is known as the **post-absorptive (fasted) state**, where your body is not processing a meal it will release other hormones (glucagon and thyroid hormones) to use brown fat as fuel to normalise blood sugar. The post-absorptive state lasts until your next meal. It is much easier for your body to burn fat in this state.

Because we don't enter the fasted state until at least five hours after our last meal, it is rare that the body enters this state when regularly eating breakfast, lunch and dinner. This is one of the reasons why many people who start intermittent fasting will lose fat without changing what they eat or how much they eat.

This style of eating lets you get some control back without having to count calories or restrict certain foods. Just set a six to eight hour window to eat and only have water outside of this window. Sleeping of course can take up a big part of that sixteen hour fast, so you just have to workout whether to skip breakfast or skip supper.

Try to keep your calories the same when you start intermittent fasting (most people eat one or two larger meals). Additionally, intermittent fasting is a good way to keep muscle mass constant.

Perhaps most importantly, intermittent fasting is one of the simplest strategies we have for taking bad weight off while keeping good weight on because it requires very little behavior change. This is a very good thing because it means intermittent fasting can be simple enough that you'll actually do it, but meaningful enough that it will actually make a difference.

Get organised and give it a go for two weeks and see if you feel healthier.

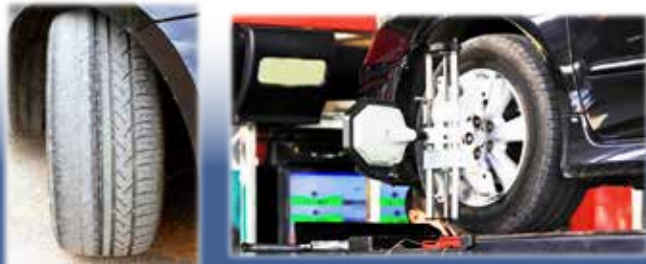

Rainfall for November was 93.5mm (almost four inches). That must be about the highest rainfall for a month in 2020.

But December, at the time of writing this on the 20th, has only seen 6.5mm fall. However, the weatherman predicts it's going to be wet for the next few weeks!

Marrow and **pumpkin** are plants with large leaves, so they need a lot of water; also, a small handful of garden manure helps encourage growth. Heat is also needed for a good crop and don't forget to pinch the runners off just past a female flower.



Transplanting **leek** and **brussel** plants can still be done in January, but they do better if planted out before Christmas.

GardeninG with Albert



Garlic and **shallots** are showing signs of drying off now, so it won't be long before I will lift them out to dry off in an airy place. After the garlic is dry you can cut the tops off about two inches above the bulb.

Tomatoes - when the weather is hot they need to be watered every second day. They should never be left to dry out completely then have a lot of watering as this can cause blossom end rot on their fruit. That is a large black patch on the fruit where the flower had been.

Apples - it is best to thin before they get too big, which gives the remaining fruit more room to grow larger and you still get a heavy crop.

Blackbirds are enjoying this time of year with the **raspberries** and **black and red currants** now ripening. It is best to pick them early in the morning or late in the afternoon, that gives you a chance of getting most of the crop.

Onion tops will need to be turned down when they start to dry off so that they can put more growth into their bulbs rather than their tops.

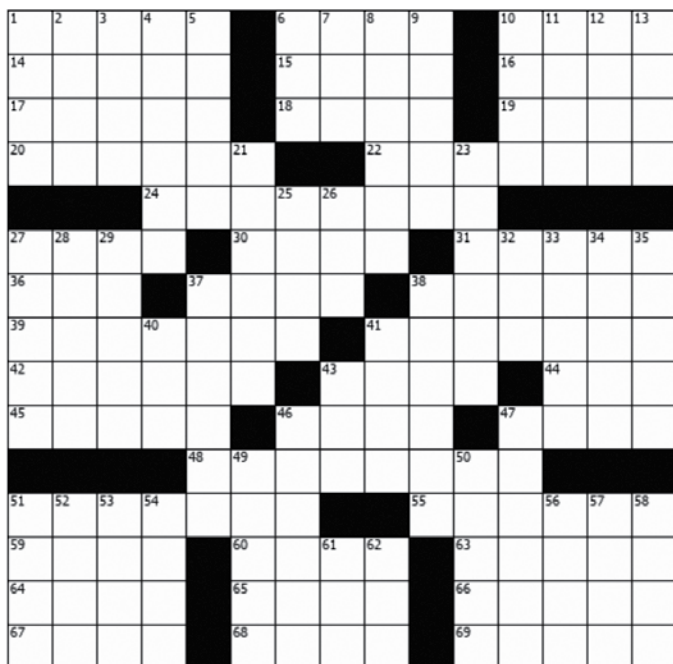

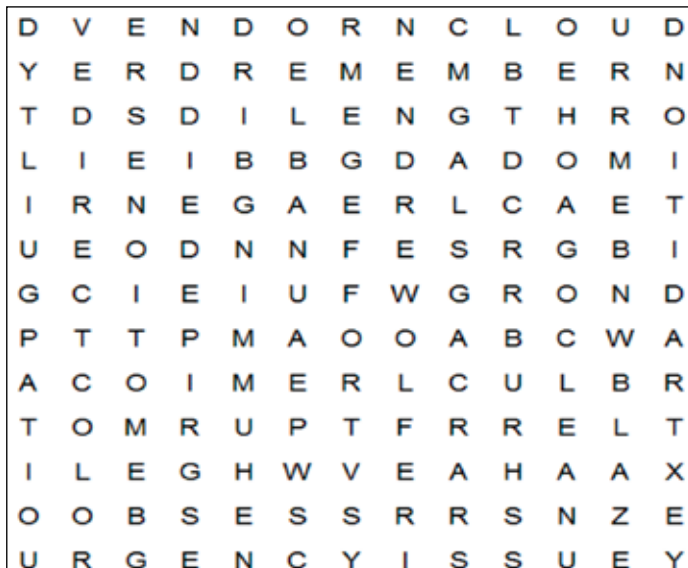


