Our recovery plan for the regions

Our regions are a vital part of Labour's economic recovery plan. We are home to innovative and creative businesses, and the backbone of our export economy - which is why Labour will continue to support our regions to grow as together, we rebuild better.

Grab a handkerchief or square piece of cotton fabric.




Fold the handkerchief from the top inwards.




Then fold from the bottom inwards to form 3 layers of thickness.




Loop two hair ties or elastic bands over the ends.



TALKING HEALTH AND FITNESS with Shave

Strengthen your core to stop your back hurting. How many times do we hear that from apparent health professionals?


"Ok, I'll do a bunch of sit-ups and she'll be right!"

Let me break down a few myths around improving spinal stability and perhaps decreasing that pain in your back.

Firstly, the support structures of the spine are complex and layered. There are very deep local muscles which keep one vertebrae stable to another. Then there are more global support structures that brace the spine longitudinally. The latissimus dorsi and obliques play a role here too. Finally there are more powerful movement muscles which are responsible for allowing us to move our trunk; i.e, bending (forwards, back and sideways) and twisting.

What needs strengthening/reactivating in order for a more stable spine are the deeper (inner unit) muscles. Namely the multifidus and the transversus abdominis. These muscles should 'switch-on' milliseconds before the movement of arms or legs in order to create a stable safe platform to move from. Also this protects the spinal column through which all the messages are sent.

"You can't fire a cannon from a canoe" as the saying goes.



What causes dysfunction and switching-off of these deeper inner unit muscles?

- Organ inflammation/dysfunction most organs have pain fibres that run into the muscle system along the spine.
- Visceroptosis (dropping, or prolapse, of internal organs due to lack of support from pelvic floor and abdominal wall) therefore a squashing of the organs.
- Obesity changes the centre of gravity to forward of pelvis.
- Diet/medicine consuming things which create inflammation in the gut such as preservatives, additives and alcohol cause weakening to trunk muscles.
- Lifestyle stress affects internal workings of the body.

Previous injury or pain in the trunk/spine will cause the body to switch off muscles in affected area so as not to cause more damage (negative feedback loop) the body then learns to operate at a level without switching them on. The muscles surrounding the injury can also go into spasm to protect the

Which exercises target this inner unit of the core?

That depends on the state of disrepair. But building from the inside out if you are not sure is always the best option.

The first two exercises are done from the quadruped position (hands and knees);

- 4-point hollow vacuum breathing breathe-in let belly relax, breathe-out and draw belly-button upto spine without
- Bird dog extend right arm and left leg out straight with core vacuumed.



'Bird Dog' exercise

The next two are from lying down on your back;

- Single leg lowering knees at 90 degrees and lower one heel to the floor with control, return back up then other heel.

Return to full timetable for Timaru flights

Demand at Timaru Richard Pearse Airport sees it being one of the first places in the country to get 100% of its scheduled Air New Zealand services running again.

Mid-September the airline increased to 12 return services on the Timaru to Wellington route, and then 13 weekly return services from 28 September onwards on its Q300 aircraft.

Timaru District Mayor Nigel Bowen said he was pleased to see the flights coming back online, stressing the importance of the direct link to the capital.

"Timaru Airport and our direct link to Wellington is an important asset for the whole region's economy, and it's fantastic that Air New Zealand is coming back up to full service so quickly.

"We're making it easier than ever to fly direct from Timaru, with increased parking and four new EV charging spaces currently being installed.

"This is a vote of confidence in our region by Air New Zealand, but to ensure we keep this important link it's important that it's supported by local businesses and residents, so now is the time to get out and about or even invite your lower North Island friends and relatives for a visit!"

From 28 September Air New Zealand will run two return flights daily leaving Timaru at 6.45am and 11.45am and leaving Wellington at 9.55am and 5.40pm.

Air New Zealand Head of Tourism and Regional Affairs Reuben Levermore says the airline is delighted to bring back its full pre-COVID-19 schedule for the Timaru-Wellington service from 28 September, offering options for both business and leisure travellers.

"This coupled with the Government's lifting of physical distancing restrictions on aircraft mean that we're keen to welcome customers onto the service and also play our part in boosting the local economy."

Timaru Richard Pearse Airport is owned and operated by Timaru District Council, it was recently given a major upgrade to its terminal and parking facilities. A further upgrade to provide 18 short stay parking spaces and 4 EV charging stations is currently underway.



Gardening with Albert

On Friday 18th September we woke to 13mm of rain and new snow down to the base of the hills, but fortunately most of it had melted by Saturday night, so we may have missed any resulting heavy frosts. By the time I wrote this column 44mm of rain has fallen so far this month.

It's a month into spring and the soil is now warming up, so it's time to sow your small seeds if you haven't already done so. This will give them a good start before the nor-west winds arrive.

More **peas** can be sown again now to give a continuous supply to pick. Onward, peas are a large pea and they grow higher and need good staking, also - they are a lot easier to pod.

Tomato, cucumber and **peppers** can now be planted in your glasshouse. If planting outside it is best to leave until later in the month. Greenfly like pepper plants so the plant will need spraying if they appear.

Potatoes - mould the soil up before planting your potatoes for good results. Add some potato manure you moud the soil.

Asparagus will be ready to cut shortly, they need to be cut just below the surface of the soil. They grow quickly on hot days and will need to be picked every second day.

Raspberry canes are now greening up and they need a spray with Mavrik for the bud moth and again before they are ready to pick.

Peach and **nectarine** trees need another spraying of copper at petal fall for the curly leaf and another spray next month.

Tender vegetables - the main sowing of cucumber, marrow, pumpkin, sweetcorn, runner beans and dwarf beans etc, may be done around the middle to the end of October. They are all gross feeders so they all need a lot of compost and water when the weather is dry.

Strawberries should be growing well by now, all the old brown leaves should have been removed and a spray of copper oxychloride for a good crop.



Flowering shrubs - if you want to prune them back it is best to do this after they finish flowering. Also, cut away any dead or diseased wood.

Daffodils - with a fairly dry winter and a few strong winds lately there were many bright displays around the Temuka gardens. They brighten up the day for everyone.

Not far now to Christmas!


